

## SCENARIO 1: ENET - EUROPEAN EDUCATION NETWORK



In 2025, eTwinning has evolved into a **European Education Network (eNet)**, a centralised network of networks which unites different education stakeholders together. The platform is owned and managed by the European Commission and is available in all the **official languages**. eNet has become part of the **initial teacher training (ITT)** and an eTwinning "license" is given to all teachers. As **safety and security** is of paramount importance for eNet, all other users are requested to undergo verification process when requesting a username and a password.

eNet is now the main working tool for any teacher in Europe, through which their **Personal Teaching Record** is developed. This is linked to a career recognition system. eNet enables teachers to share and access high quality resources for free (through an open content license) in different European languages, prepare classes, document their work, assess their students, connect with other teachers through projects, look for jobs, search and apply for training and be active in suggesting changes in the curricula.

**Parents** are also able to log in specific areas to view their children's progress. **Students**, on the other hand, have their own pages on this new tool, but their activity can be monitored at any time by their teacher. Students feel it is a fun way of maintaining a form of "diary" of their scholastic work and collaborating with students from other schools. **Education researchers** have a section where they share articles which could be useful for teachers.
